

# TriHealth COVID-19 Vaccination Scheduling Tip Sheet



We are excited to continue our commitment to be an essential provider of COVID-19 vaccines, following Governor DeWine's guidelines. Remember, appointments are required.

## Ways to schedule

### 1. Self-scheduling directly through MyChart

Go to **MyChart.TriHealth.com** and log in. Under MENU, click on SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT, then COVID VACCINE 1<sup>ST</sup> DOSE. Follow the instructions to pick the best day, time and location for you. (Scheduling instructions and a tutorial video are available at [TriHealth.com/Vaccine](https://TriHealth.com/Vaccine) and in MyChart.) If you do not have MyChart, you can sign up at **TriHealth.com/MyChartSignup**.

### 2. Self-scheduling through TriHealth.com

Go to **TriHealth.com/Vaccine** and click on the blue SCHEDULE A COVID-19 VACCINE WITHOUT A MYCHART ACCOUNT button. Follow the instructions to pick the best day, time and location for you. (Scheduling instructions and a tutorial video are available at **TriHealth.com/Vaccine**.)

### 3. TriHealth COVID-19 Vaccine Call Center

### 4. Check the ODH list

## What you should know

- As we receive vaccines, appointments will be added to the schedule. Please check back to find open appointments. Understand that it will take time to vaccinate the entire community, but great progress already is being made.
- Only one caregiver may escort you to the clinic if necessary; no children will be allowed.
- Minors age 16 and 17 who are receiving vaccines must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

## On the day of your vaccine

- Bring your identification and insurance cards (you will not be charged, but if you have insurance your provider will be billed the cost of the administration).
- Be prepared to schedule your second dose during your first appointment (21 or 28 days after the first), if you get a vaccine that requires two doses.
- Stay on-site for at least 15 minutes following your vaccination to be sure you have no adverse reactions.
