




Cancer Institute

“ ‘Hope must be defined in a broader sense – hope is about time, about caring for people for as long as they have. We cannot take our eye off that. It’s why we have invested the way we have.’ National averages tell us that 65 percent of cancer patients have a five year survival rate. Success cannot always be measured by outcomes alone, sometimes it should be measured by quality of time. Building a dedicated division of oncology, investing in workforce, infusion therapy, cellular therapy and infrastructure are all currently being pursued as options for how TriHealth will battle this epidemic.”
