Friends,



This past year has been a great experience at McCullough-Hyde. There are so many wonderful qualities about our community hospital, including our dedicated donors. Your commitments to the Trust have continued to provide ongoing support for education, equipment, and services and there are so many things that we simply could not do without your investment. In fact, your gifts and pledges from 2014 totaled over \$450,000. This provided \$15,500 for the Oxford College Corner Free Clinic to underwrite medications and women's services through the Helen Weinberger and the General Fund; over \$19,000 to support staff education and continuing education through the Larry Kist, Richard Daniels, Christopher Daniels Memorial Funds, as well as through the Alberta Lutz Intel, Sheffield Jeck, Garvin McClain, and Biz Campbell Funds; in addition to \$10,000 to support the Professional Development Assistance Program as well as the core regulatory classes for Health Stream staff education. Overall, the Trust had over \$132,000 in expenditures to support our community hospital. Our invested Trust assets, which provide financial stability to McCullough-Hyde, ended 2014 valued at \$10.5 million. Approximately \$2.5 million of these funds are restricted for various purposes, while the remaining is invested by our Board of Directors to fund future capital, equipment, service and education needs.

As with all Trust efforts, this project will focus on fundraising to support our community hospital so donations will continue to stay here.

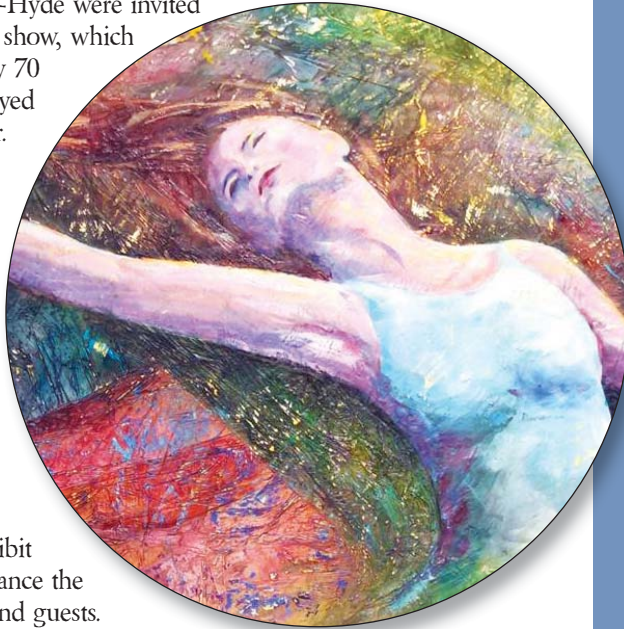

Healing Art Exhibit:

McCullough-Hyde Memorial Hospital called upon area artists for the fifth time to partner in creating a healing environment for patients and families through the annual "Healing Art" exhibit on April 24th. Artists within a 100-mile radius of McCullough-Hyde were invited to submit work for the annual juried art show, which resulted in the selection of approximately 70 original pieces of art that are now displayed throughout the hospital for the next year.

Local artist and teacher Jean Vance assisted McCullough-Hyde in managing the Healing Art Exhibit and was especially pleased, once again, that jurored artwork in the exhibit was eligible for approximately \$6,000 in Purchase Awards. Eight pieces of art were purchased for the hospital's permanent collection via the Purchase Awards. Anyone can purchase the remaining art, for which prices are designated by the artist. The current exhibit will be up until April 2016 and will enhance the healing environment for patients, staff, and guests.
