This fire department has been protecting the City of Oxford and Miami University since 1833. They cover 54 square miles. John Detherage became fire chief in 2008. They are a combination department consisting of 70+ employees. Last year they made 2298 EMS runs.

The City of Oxford Fire Department is continuing their involvement within the community by increasing their participation with the local schools. Fire department personnel have recently begun visiting classrooms and reading children's books to preschool students once a month.

In addition to this engagement with the schools, the fire department set up a booth at the Kramer Elementary School Carnival where they had the opportunity to speak with students and their parents about fire safety. The Fire Department has also partnered up with Tallawanda Schools in developing a "Stop the Bleed" program and establishing numerous bleeding control kits throughout the schools. They will be deployed soon.

The Butler County LEPC and Enterprise Products designed Ohio's First Pipeline Exercise on September 20, 2018. The 2018 Butler County Full Scale Exercise simulated a pipeline release into the Great Miami River. The exercise included players from several public safety agencies in Butler County as well as resources from Enterprise Products and agencies and organizations.

This exercise gave Butler County LEPC an opportunity to test the community's ability to respond to a pipeline emergency.

The 2018 Butler County Full Scale Exercise was a large scale exercise focused on public-private partnerships to develop a coordinated response to an emergency. The exercise included hazardous materials clean-up on an important waterway in the county and provided opportunities to test water rescue, incident command and mass care operations. The opportunity tested the policies and procedures against such a large scenario.

The benefits from this disaster exercise will be blossom for years to come. It was an opportunity to show how the Butler County EMA and the Butler County EMA and the Butler County LEPC are leading the way.

Operation Cincinnati: S.M.A.R.T

On August 14th, four independent health systems: TriHealth, The Christ Hospital Health Network, Mercy Health and UC Health signed nine year agreements with the U.S. military.


This agreement provides specialized medical training to Active, Reserve and Guard personnel from all branches of service. Operation Hospital S.M.A.R.T. (Strategic Medical Asset Readiness Training), is now being implemented in four Cincinnati hospitals. This operation helps to establish a national network of health care facilities that will provide critical medical training to our nation's service members. Colonel Brad Wenstrup, US Representative, The Health Collaborative and several leaders from Army, Army Reserve, Ohio National Guard, and United States Air Force hosted the kickoff event.





