## Fiscal Year 2016: Year in Review

- Through the Foundation's unrestricted investments, the Foundation Board of Trustees distributed \$938,000 to support:
  - The purchase of Special Care Obstetrics Fetal Monitors for Women's Services. These monitors are the most advanced, state-of-the-art equipment that helps care teams make the best possible treatment decisions for both mother and baby.
  - The renovation of the Radiation Oncology Department, which will complete the final phase of the TriHealth Cancer Institute Good Samaritan Hospital Campus. The project will streamline our care system into a fully coordinated hub that navigates care for patients from diagnosis through treatment and survivorship.
  - The Delirium Project in Good Samaritan's intensive care units to reduce the risk of delirium, which is "a serious disturbance in mental abilities." The funds have enabled the ICU care teams to implement evidence-based strategies including environmental modifications, equipment upgrades, and improved care protocols.
- Also, because of investments and the generosity of donors, the Foundation invested \$1 million into Good Samaritan Hospital to ensure Good Sam is able to maintain its strong tradition of providing high quality, compassionate care to every person who walks through our doors, regardless of their ability to pay. The Foundation is proud to support this work that began with the Sisters of Charity more than 160 years ago.
- The Good Samaritan Free Health Center continues to provide a compassionate, patient-centered medical home for uninsured, disadvantaged adults in Hamilton County. Because of the generosity of donors and volunteers, the 100% philanthropically funded Center is now the largest urban free clinic in the State of Ohio. In FY 2016, the Center provided more than 6,000 patient visits and more than 8,200 volunteer hours, and the Foundation provided \$517,219 of support.
- At the Good Samaritan College of Nursing and Health Science, 95 students received more than \$165,000 in scholarship assistance for the 2015-2016 school year because of the generosity of donors. These scholarships help decrease students' debt while they are receiving a high quality education, which positions them for success in the future to provide excellent clinical and compassionate care. Also this year, GSC was excited to welcome and inaugurate its new President, James Hauschildt.
- The Good Samaritans of Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation held their 32<sup>nd</sup> annual gala which raised \$500,000 to support the development of the Good Samaritan Hospital Concussion Management Program, the Good Samaritan Free Health Center, and the Medical Education Research Fund. The Good Samaritans have cumulatively raised more than \$7.3 million through this annual event.
- The Good Samaritan Hospital Guild also continued its support of many initiatives within Good Samaritan by awarding more than \$137,000 for equipment, supplies, and more that directly impact patient care. Examples include prayer shawls, quilt materials for the NICU, recliners for patient rooms, an infant warmer, supplies for at-risk patients, and more.
